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- I, , Sara Alan-Smith, am a member of the Canine Massage Guild, having completed the 2 year Clinical Canine Massage Practitioner Programme externally accredited by LANTRA* via the Canine Massage Therapy Centre in 2015 (* known formerly at that time as the Therapeutic Canine Massage Diploma accredited by Ascentis)

- The Canine Massage Guild began participating in the world's first clinical trials assessing the 'Effect of massage therapy on pain and quality of life in dogs' in 2018 with Winchester University and Sparsholt University Centre. The results of this study, published in Vet Record on 13 June 2021, showed "significant decrease in pain severity following canine massage therapy", with 95% of dogs responding positively to the treatment. - Each year I commit to undertaking a minimum of 25 hours CPD as part of the Canine Massage Guild's strong codes of ethics and conduct.
- I hold my own professional indemnity and public liability insurance which is audited annually by the Canine Massage Guild.
- I always abide by the Veterinary Surgeons Act 1966 and Veterinary Surgery (Exemptions) Order 2015, by never working on an animal without gaining prior veterinary consent. As stated by the RCVS, "Physiotherapy' is interpreted as including all kinds of manipulative therapy" (Section 19.21), thus including massage therapy. Manipulation under massage therapy is limited to (or refers to) soft tissues and assessing a joint's range of motion using passive movements. I do not manipulate joints like a chiropractor.
- I specialise in the use of Remedial Sports Massage, Deep Tissue Massage, Swedish Massage and Myofascial Release, utilising the Lenton Method[®] of advanced palpation, body mapping and application of massage therapy, including myofascial release techniques unique to the Lenton Method[®]. - I ensure continuity of client care by providing a written report back to you / your surgery upon completion of a client's initial massage sessions.

- Clinical Canine Massage Therapy is suitable for soft tissue injury rehabilitation, and for the chronic pain management of orthopaedic conditions, as well as pre and post-operative care. It is commonly used amongst sporting, performance and agility competitors too.
